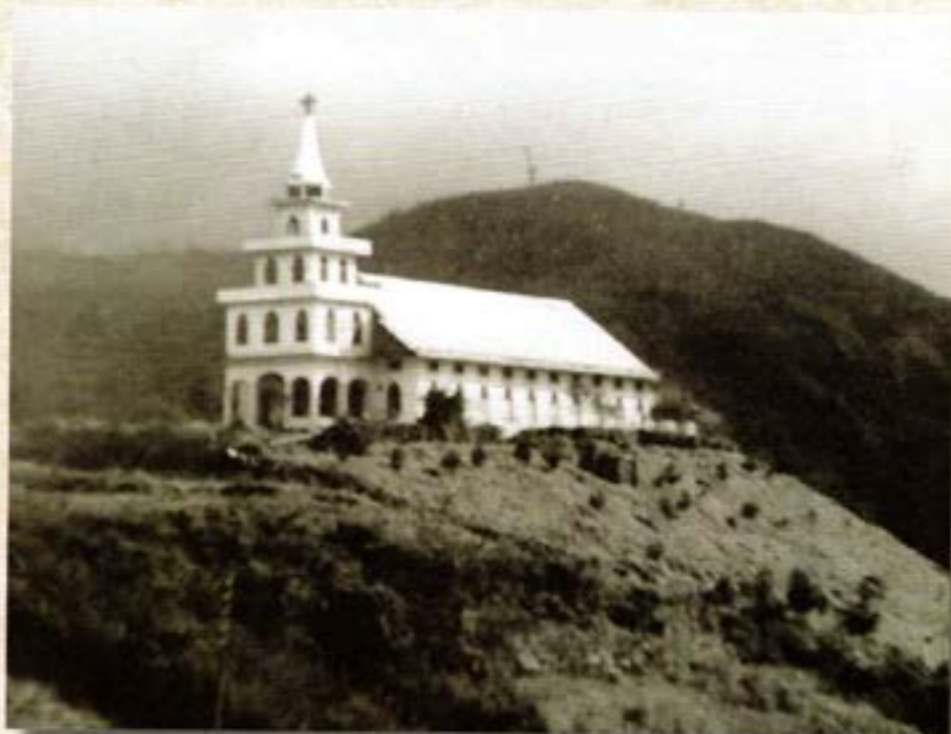

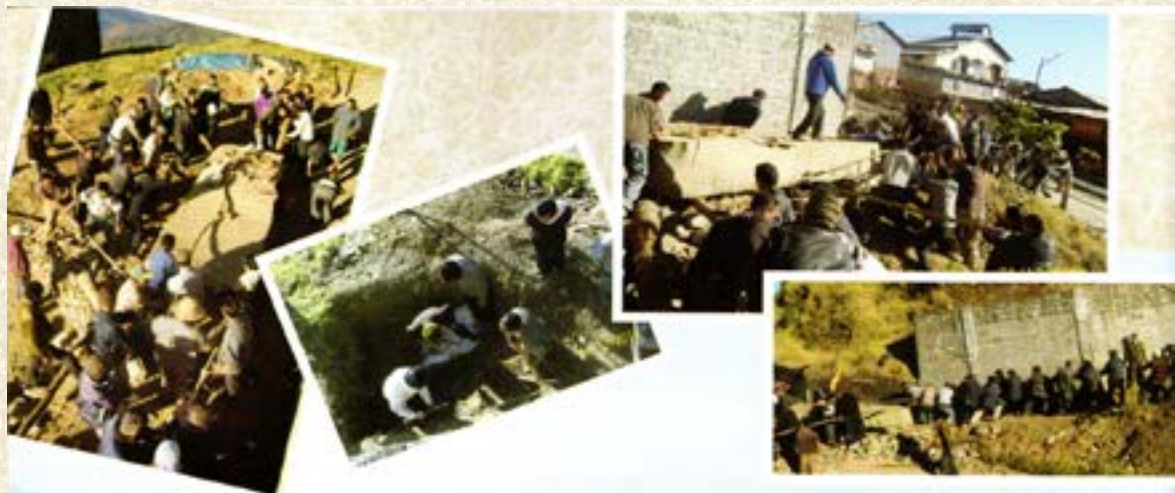

History of

PFÜTSERO TOWN BAPTIST CHURCH - Rev. Z. Mero

Genesis: The formation of Pfütsero Town Baptist Church was different from the way the village churches had formed. In most villages, churches had started with converts from animism but this town church grew out of the fellowship of CBCC staff along with the early settlers of the town. The early churches of the entire Chakhesang area at one time came under the banner of Kohima District Church Council but in order to administer the word of God more effectively, the Chakhesang Church Council is formed in the year 1950 with its Centre at Phezu, Phek. But since the place was given to the Assam Rifle by the local people there arose the need to shift the Centre. When a decision was to be taken by the Council, concerning shifting of the Centre to a new place, most areas wanted to have the Centre set up in their areas and for which the Council had met many times to resolve the impasse. Ultimately, the Council decided that the matter should be resolved by lot. With prayer the lot was taken and it went in favour of Pfütsero. Following this, the CBCC Mission Centre started to function at Pfütsero in the year 1961.

When the Mission Staff settled down at this town I was then asked to look after the Sunday programmes as pastor. Then I also approached the teachers of Government High School to get their cooperation in starting regular Sunday services in the school and their response was very positive. With the beginning of Sunday worship services, Sunday School classes also begins.

For some years, the church was functioning in this borrowed building but not forgetting its task of mission. It may be also noted that even prior to 1961 some kind of informal fellowship was in existence amongst the few settlers of the place with Ngulo Khape as in-charge of the fellowship.




BUILDING OF THE FIRST CHURCH: Once the fellowship of the believers begins in any place, it is natural that building a church of its own becomes the common concern of every believer. As the Mission Centre was in its infancy stage coupled with thin settlers of the town the school building was continue to be used for about two years. At the same time the search was on to acquire the church site and we succeeded in acquiring one location opposite to the present site which was given by the Kapfo clan of Lekromi village. At that site, the first church building made of thatch materials, measuring 50'X30'was erected in the year 1963.In the following year the first Christmas Feast was offered to the members of this Church by Mr & Mrs Benyi Kapfo. But before too long, the church was completely burnt down due to wild fire and, therefore, we shifted the place of our fellowship to the Bible School in Mission Compound. When the plan to build a new church was contemplated, the original site had come to be considered as too small from the future point of view. Therefore, the present site was proposed for selection. The decision to build the church at this site was initially opposed by some members saying that it was not easily accessible to many of the members in those days there were hardly any inhabitant, except few Government offices, beyond Menyitsüda range. But due to some kind of divine intervention everyone could finally welcome the selection of the site.

The site which was proposed and accepted for construction of the church belonged to two groups of people. A portion of it belonged to PFUTSEROMI VILLAGE and the other portion of it belonged to VERO CLAN OF KIKRUMA VILLAGE, THE DECENDANTS OF LATE YINÜ VERO, the founder of Kikrūma Village. But when we approached them with the request to give us their land to build the church there they happily offered it for the greater Glory of God. And as we celebrate the Golden Jubilee age of our church, we implore God's blessing for the Vero Clan of Kikrūma and Pfutseromi Village for the generosity demonstrated through deeds.

Since this very site was used as helipad by the army and that the situation was not yet normal like today there were some difficulties to procure it. However, around this time, by providence, a believer from South India was there as Commander at this army post. When we approached him with our humble request, stating to him that the town was not yet having a church building of its own and that we wanted to build our church at their very helipad, he answered us saying that it was not within his authority to grant us our prayer but he was so kind hearted and, therefore, he directed us as to how we should approach the higher set up in order to succeed in our plan. Following his guidelines, the church leaders along with the prominent public

leaders of the town approached the GOC at Jakhama with our request. After a while, with God's help, the GOC had directed us to approach the State Government. Without delay we established contact with those in power and finally it was handed over to us with the visit of Sri N. Theyo, the then Transport Minister of Nagaland, on the 16th of October 1973. With a prayer by Rev. V.K.Nuh the visiting Minister had pronounced that the works of the new church building could begin henceforth. Concerning the selection of this site we believe that the Spirit of God was intervening on our behalf because it was also revealed to some people in dreams that the Word of God would be proclaimed from this place.

The first church built on this helipad was 80 feet in length and 42 feet in width and for this construction work Mr. Pfükrünyi Kazhie was the Building Committee Chairman and Mr. Ngulo Kronu was the Treasurer. For this undertaking, the Church had resorted to raising of fund through allotting of budget to all households once and one time free will donation. Different leaders and the contractors of our town had done their best in finding different types of works for earning by the members without taxing so much on the individual families. It took a little more than three years to build the church at the cost of Rs. 1,47,383/-. And on the 2nd of April 1977, the church was dedicated to God with the presence of Rev. Longri Ao, the then General Secretary of NBCC. In order to administer the word of God more effectively in the pastoral ministry, I was ordained on the same occasion as recommended by the CBCC.

 **THE GROWTH OF THE CHURCH:** In the beginning, when the church was yet to have a building of its own, the members consisted of the CBCC Centre staff, teachers and few others who settled down in the town. With the increasing population of the town the congregation of the church also grew but for some years most churches in villages were not willing to issue Transfer Certificate to their members. On account of this, for about five years no one had brought their TC. The matter was discussed very seriously even at the CBCC level and after appealing many times to the pastors the members had started bringing their TC to the church. The first baptised person to bring TC to our church was Puchotolü from Porbami church in the month of May in 1966. After realising the need of TC by the church for its members, the pastors of different villages started to issue TC to their members asking for it and the baptised membership began to grow.

From 1961 to 1970 I was serving as pastor on part time basis. In between this period, late T. Medo also served as pastor for one year on the same basis in the year 1968.

My pastoral ministry on full time basis commenced from 1970 to 1994.

The church leaders, seeing the prospect of its growth, had planned that the church should extend itself in three directions in future - East (Reku), West (PWD) and North (Rukizu). However, at present, we have sixteen independent churches in this township. And amongst them the following four churches are the direct offspring of this church: 1. Revival Church (1976); 2. Mission Church (1980); 3. Rukizu Baptist Church (1984); and 4. Calvary Baptist church (1988). These four churches got separated themselves from the parent church, not on account of disagreement, but on convenience. In spite of the emergence of so many churches in the same township, the membership of this church has not dwindled. On the contrary, this parent church is growing fastest.

In the year 1988 a Revival Meeting was conducted by our church in which 112 persons had taken baptism in a day. In the course of my pastoral ministry, I have given baptism to so many people but this was the largest number of people that I had given in a day. Again, in the year 1990, Parents' Camp and Youth Holiday Camp were conducted, at different times, leading to baptism of 115 persons. Following these events, the numerical strength of the church grew more rapidly and for all these, we give thanks to the Almighty.

Prior to 1990s, the church was not in a position to focus much on outside mission. In the earlier years, the task of the church was directed more towards home evangelism and sponsoring few non local students to study theology to prepare them for mission work. During the initial years of BTC, our church sponsored the salary of the Principal. In 1990s, the church started to sponsor two native missionaries in Arunachal Pradesh. The two missionaries being sponsored by us at present are Bigo Doke, Executive Secretary of GBCC and Jomto Eshi, Evangelist. Recently, we started sponsoring two missionaries Subrai and Sukumar in Tripura.

During the last three decades, the Church undertook several projects such as building Sunday School class rooms, Church Guest House, School, Pastor's Residences, Mission Project

Building, and the herculean task of building a New Church. The need to start the Sunday School to strengthen the Church in its foundation was felt for quite some years and the same was constructed in 1983. This was followed by a bigger project the construction of the church guest house and-meeting place. The plot of the present Guest House was purchased in 1984 and there a two-storey building was constructed where the quests were accommodated in the ground floor and the first floor was used by Rev. Akha Shupao, who was the then pastor. In order to support outside mission, in 1989 a

plot was purchased in Dimapur and we erected a building there which was inaugurated in 1990 and the same is being looked after by the Church Mission Department. The Church Guest House which was constructed near the Saw Mill was considered to be a little far from the church, therefore the construction of another Guest House, nearer to the church, started in 1993 and a part of it was completed in the year 1994 and the same was used for sometime in 1995. But since the place was too close to the Army Camp it was considered to be inconvenient in certain ways. Therefore, it was converted into a school. Accordingly, the Baptist School was started in 1996 with the initiation of Rev. Akha Shupao. This School was established with the aim of imparting quality education which will strengthen the Church. The school was upgraded to class 10 standard in 2006 and over the years we have been noticing healthy signs of growth.

Realising the need to have a proper residence for pastor, a plot adjacent to the church with temporary structure was purchased way back in 1978 and the church caretaker stayed there. After the completion of the first floor in 2003, Pastor Rev. Akha Shupao was accommodated there for some time.

Later the ground floor for Associate Pastor was completed in 2004. When Rev. Dr. N. Chiero assumed the office of pastorship in 2004, the school was in need of an Assembly Hall and therefore we constructed it in 2007. Also seeing the space congestion of the church compound and realising the need for future development, the site under the occupation of the AR has been acquired by the church in May 2005 by disposing a site owned by the church below the NAP Camp. But the biggest and the most challenging task awaits him the gigantic task of the New Church Building for which the Foundation Stone was laid on 21st August 2005. It was planned that this New Church should be built in the same place by dismantling the old structure. The cost of the New Church Building was first estimated at Rs. 150 Lakhs. And the first hand construction to this herculean task was started with much enthusiasm on the first working day of January 2008. But as we entered the fourth year of construction the actual expenditure has already exceeded Rs.200 Lakhs. At the same time, with God's unending grace coupled with the able Pastorship of Rev. Dr. N. Chiero and the cheerful giver of the church members, we are in a position to dedicate this New Church building humbly before the Glory of God on 17th December 2011. The dedication of the New Church building will be followed by the grand celebration of the Church Golden Jubilee.

“Proclaim LIBERTY” - Rev. Dr. Neingupe Chiero,
(LEVITICUS 25:10) Pastor


*P***FÜTSERO** Town Baptist Church proclaims liberty as we celebrate Golden Jubilee with the theme “Proclaim Liberty”. With this theme I wholeheartedly greet all the believers of Jesus Christ who have come to celebrate God’s faithfulness with us at this historic Golden Jubilee event. As we proclaim liberty in the name of our Saviour and Lord Jesus Christ, may the Liberator liberate you indeed from the bondage of sufferings, sin and spiritual death. This celebration should not be a repetition of normal observation of traditional Jubilee but let all the events and your personal presence converge to the real life changing experience of liberty. Let us understand the meaning and significance of Jubilee and celebrate it in spirit and in full joy.

WHAT IS JUBILEE?

Jubilee signifies liberty as it is evident from the Scripture when God himself instituted the Jubilee Year "You shall hallow the fiftieth year and you shall proclaim liberty throughout the land to all its inhabitants"(Levi.25:10). Jubilee comes on the 50th year after seven sabbatical years. The word "jubilee" comes from 'yobel' which in Hebrew is ram's horn as the trumpets which were used in proclaiming this solemnity were made of ram's horns. Other opines that, it is derived from 'yabal', meaning to bring, carry away, because the Israelites at this time carried away the rights of possessing their inheritance which had being forfeited. Other still opines that it is derived from 'hobil' meaning to cause to bring back or recall, because the property which had being alienated were then brought back to their original owners.

THE CONCEPT OF JUBILEE

The concept behind the Jubilee celebration is to liberate everyone from all sorts of bondages; bondage of poverty, bondage of suppression or even that of exploitation. Jubilee celebration cancels debts, return property to its original owners and give rest to the land from being cultivated and to enjoy the divine provision of the year. Jubilee year is a year of rest, but not cessation from works. People must not remain idle: they can catch fish, hunt animal, keep bees, tend flocks, clean and decorate homes, make furniture or weave clothes for their subsistence.



Jubilee brings us into two experiences:

First, it brings us to an experience of comfort. With the Gospel dispensation, all who believe in Christ Jesus is redeemed from the bondage of sin and shall possess the favour and the image of God, the only inheritance of the human soul, having all debts cancelled and the right of inheritance restored. Thus the experience of soul liberation requires the dispensation and reception of the gospel which the prophet Isaiah alludes in Isaiah 61: 1-2. Cf. Luke 4: 18 - 19

*The Spirit of the Lord is upon me,
Because the LORD has anointed me
To bring good news to the afflicted;
He had sent me to bind up the broken hearted,
To proclaim liberty to the captives,
And freedom to prisoners;
To proclaim the favourable year of the LORD,
And the day of vengeance to our God;
To comfort all who mourn.*


Second, it is of the general resurrection. As Parkhurst says, "It is a lively prefiguration of the grand consummation of time, which will be introduced in like manner by the trumpet of God (1 Cor. 15:52), when the children and heirs of God shall be delivered from all their forfeiture and restored to the eternal inheritance allotted to them by their Father and henceforth rest from their labours and be supported in life by what the field of God shall supply".

Christ lays down the foundation of jubilee principle as recorded in his Nazareth Manifesto (Luke 4:18 -19), he emphatically declares that the great liberty or redemption from slavery, poverty and sin is made available but the actual fulfilment of this liberty would not take place till the great Atonement. The sacrifice of the Lord Jesus, has taken place. For this reason Jubilee was not proclaimed till the tenth day of the seventh month (October), when the great annual atonement was made for the sins of the people. And now that the sacrifice is made and the grace made available to all, the free and full grace of Christ may be claimed.

NEW TESTAMENT CONCEPT OF JUBILEE:

In the New Testament the very word jubilee is not found but the principle is there. The word liberty and jubilee are identical terms. It also means justice. In this regard J.I.Packer in his Illustrated Bible Dictionary says,

"The Biblical idea of liberty (freedom) has its background on the thought of imprisonment and slavery.....Liberty means the happy state of having being released from servitude to a life of freedom and satisfaction that was not possible before. The idea of liberty appears in the Scripture in its ordinary secular application..... But it has received a significant theological development. This sprang from Israel's realization that such freedom from subjugation by foreigners as she enjoyed was God's gift to her. In New Testament, liberty has an important theological concept for describing salvation.



Today we celebrate jubilee to secure our salvation in Christ, who is our Redeemer and Liberator from the power of sin and death. Outside of him there is no other true freedom. For Jesus himself said, "If the Son shall make you free you shall be free indeed" (Jn 8:36). Jubilee freedom is freedom from sin and not freedom to it.

How to Proclaim Liberty?

The trumpet sound proclaims the liberation of those in bondage and expresses the joy of those who have been liberated. Jesus sent his apostles to proclaim liberty with the trumpet of everlasting gospel to be preached to the ends of the world and to every creature. When we accept the gospel we are liberated from the bondage of sin and guilt and we make peace with God. This paves a way for the entrance of true comfort as we live our lives here on earth. The gospel goes on to promise that Jesus Christ shall return and at the trumpet sound of his return, the dead will be released from the bondage of the grave and the physical body restored for eternity.

Jubilee is also a time of reconciliation. Reconciliation encompasses both vertical and horizontal dimensions. Vertical reconciliation requires men of repentance from their sin. Horizontal reconciliation requires restoration of relationship here on earth. It could be within a family, between friends, factions, villages, communities and nations. When we make such reconciliations amongst us, we experience liberty.


Jubilee offers this opportunity within the enabling grace of Jesus Christ who reconciled us to the one Holy and Righteous God.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF CELEBRATING JUBILEE?

If we can apply Jubilee principles in letter and spirit it brings physical, material and spiritual benefits to us. It provides security, "You shall dwell in the land for safety" (Lev. 25:18). The word signifies both outward safety and inward security and confidence of the spirit, the confidence in spirit to shun both from evil and from the fear of evil. It provides our needs, "that you can eat your fill" (Lev. 25:19). The material blessings are not for the jubilee year alone, but it is for three years; the year before jubilee, the very jubilee year, and the year after the jubilee. Thus god's blessings make provision even for the poor to be satisfied.

In all these God intends to make us understand that we can rely and trust Him for our needs. And that having cast our burden on Him, we should be more efficient in discharging our duties.

Had there been no jubilee legislation, the history of God's people would have been different. "The rich would get richer and the poor getting poorer". Jubilee prevents this advantage of the rich and disadvantage of the poor. It is a time to establish justice and equality. But when Jubilee is celebrated in numerical year and not in the actual sense, it makes no difference in the life of the believers. Bumper Jubilee celebration without



spiritual maturity will not give any uniqueness to the jubilee year from those of the other common years.

When the Israelites celebrated Jubilee they took a break from major strenuous works, so that they could spend more time in studying the Law of the Lord and in worshipping the Lord. This is the emphasis of the Jubilee year.

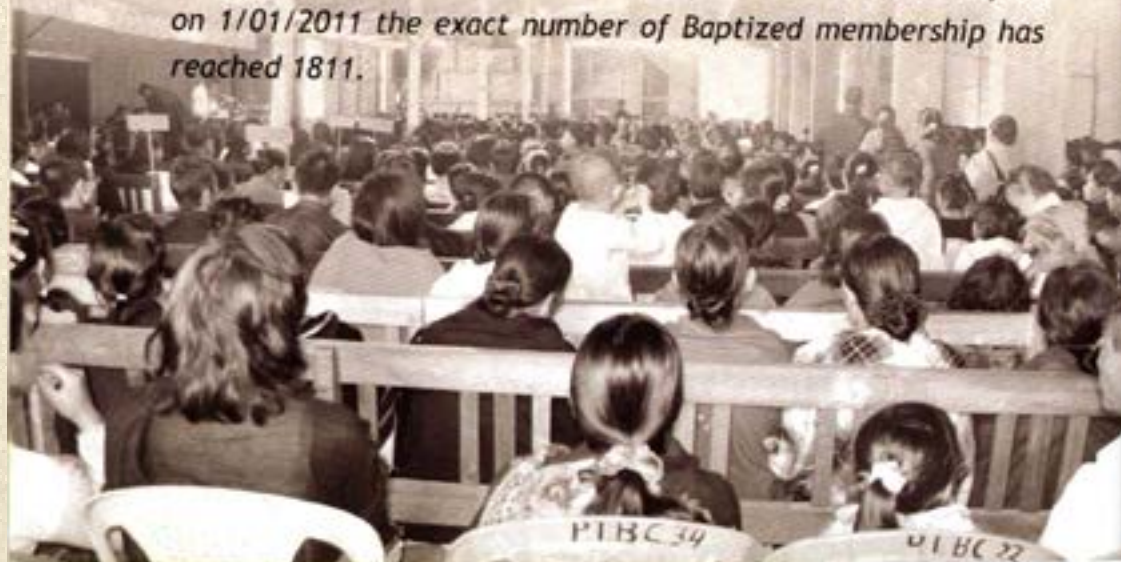
Many have celebrated their Church Golden Jubilee and many others will be celebrating, what difference can we make in our celebration? With this celebration the Jubilee Year will be completed but if we are not liberated from slavery of sin and evil forces then the purpose of Jubilee celebration is missed. But a year long preparation and activities in applying jubilee principles should make us now confident to live as liberated people and celebrate jubilee in the true spirit of joy and thereby glorify God in our words and deeds. God bless all those who have prayed for us and have joined us in dedicating our New Church Building and in celebrating our Golden Jubilee. As you go back, carry the message of "Liberty" with you.





Church STATISTICAL INFORMATION

As noted in The History of The Church, the growth in the membership of this church was extremely low in the initial two decades due to certain factors which were not within the control of this church. The membership became somewhat sizeable in the third decade only when it reached 393 in 1980 and then to 697 in 1990 as shown in table and in chart form. Prior to this, more of the people who associated themselves with this church had greater ties with the village churches. Again, it is to be noted here that from 1993-2010 the number of Baptized membership of the church, as furnished below may not be accurate due to improper record. However, as on 1/01/2011 the exact number of Baptized membership has reached 1811.



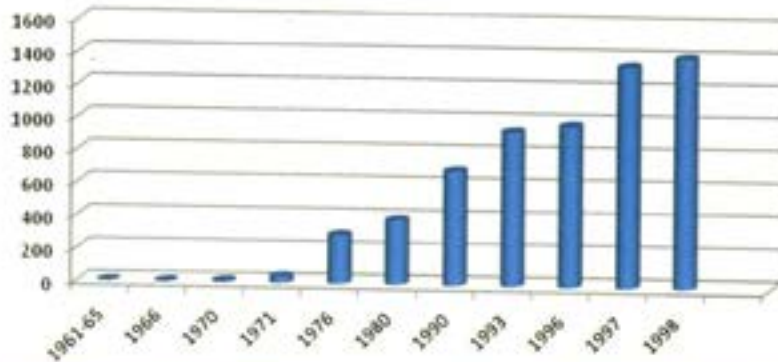

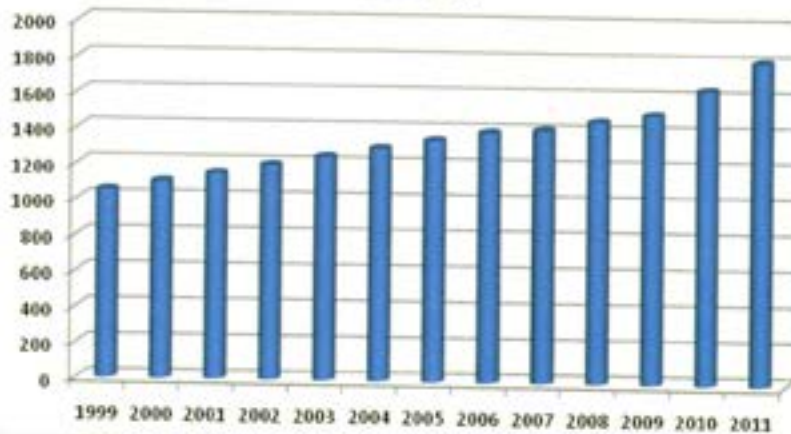

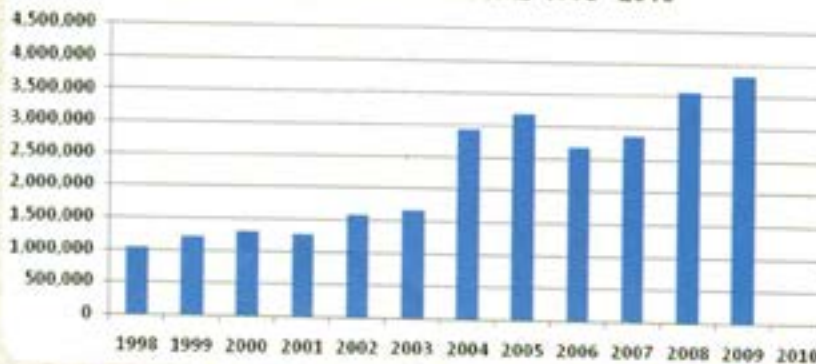
**GROWTH IN CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

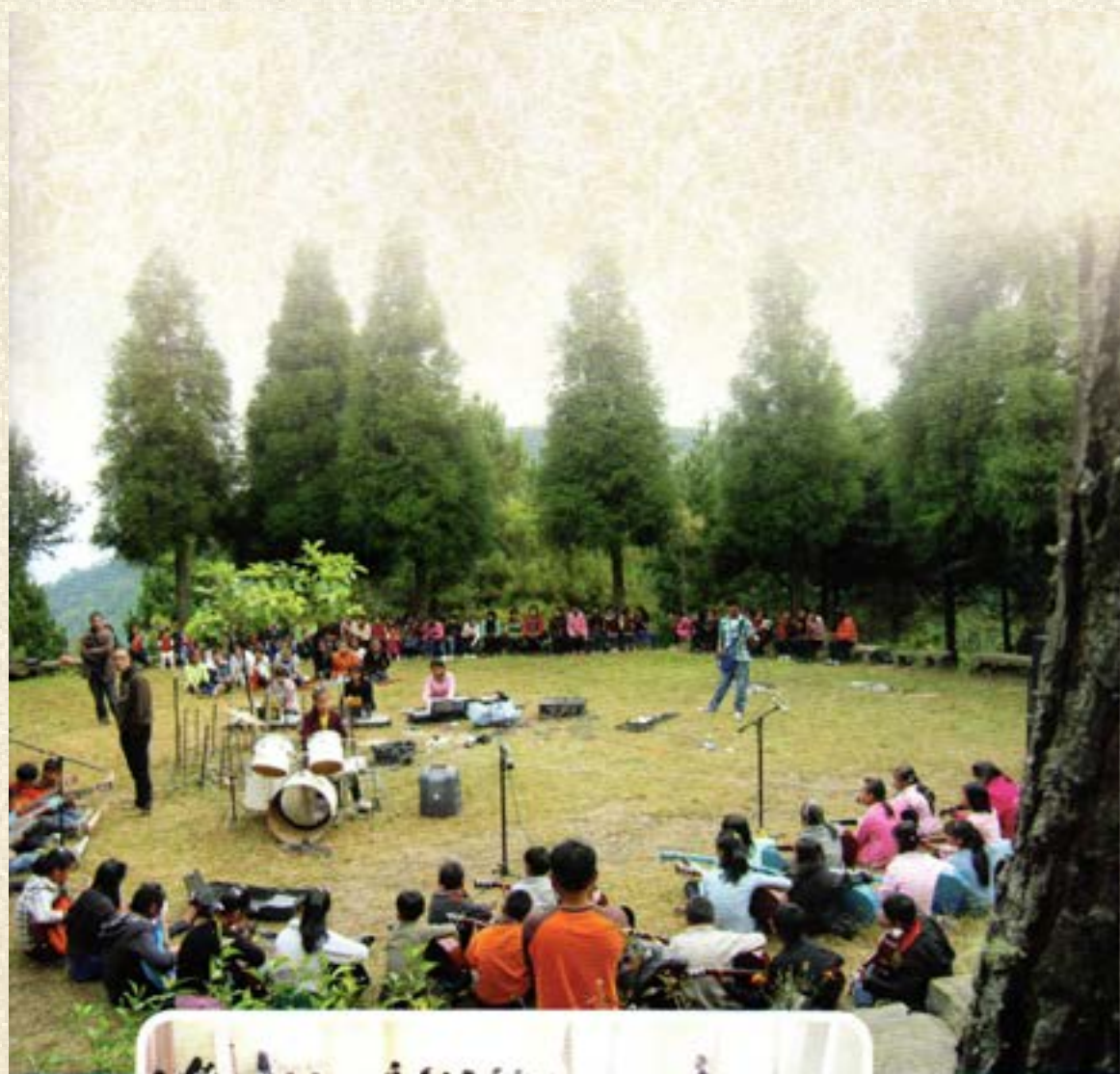

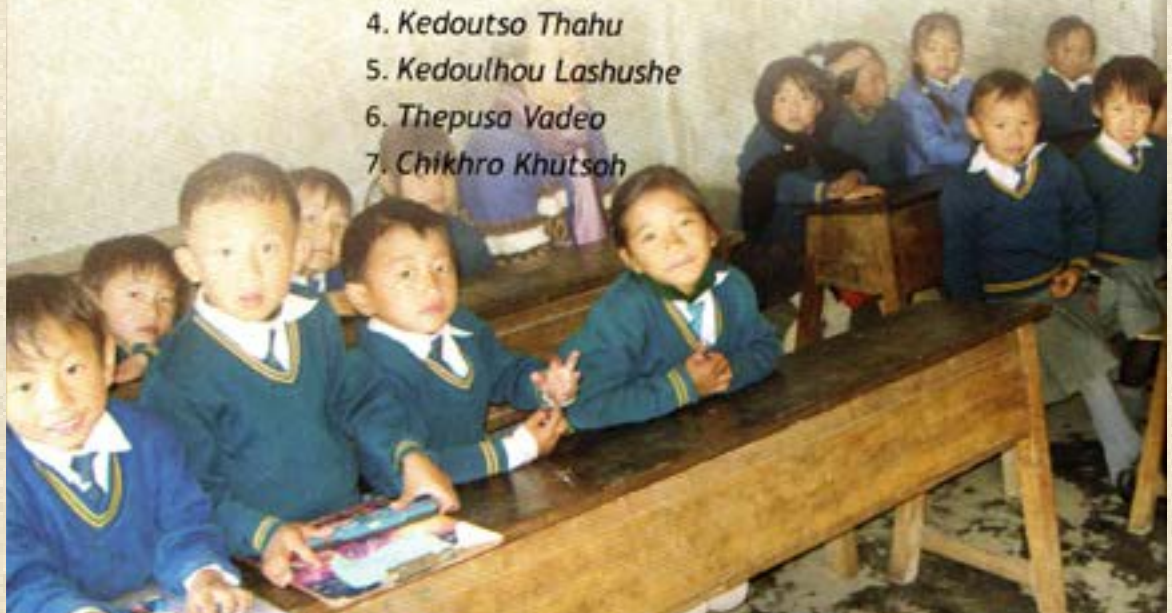


Baptist School Pfütsero
